





Performance Notes

The *Funeral Litany* may be sung at the Vigil for the Deceased or during the Funeral Mass. The petitions may be freely replaced or added to, according to the liturgical model. The family of the deceased may have suggestions.

Cantors: For the sake of variety, two cantors may be employed. The cantor(s) should sing the petitions in a natural speech rhythm; but sing "Lord, have mercy" in strict rhythm, so that the assembly can repeat it confidently.


Choir: The optional choir may begin with the cantor or better, after a few petitions have been sung. Sing softly so that the cantor's words are clearly heard and understood.

Organist: Play gently, just enough to support the voices.

They Will Never Hunger may be sung as a "coda" to the Funeral Litany, or entirely separately at another time during the Vigil or Funeral Mass. It is also especially appropriate for the Fifth Sunday of Lent (Year A), during the Easter season, or for saints' days.
