Composer Notes

Composed in a gospel-anthem style with lyrics drawn from Micah, the Psalms, and Saint John's Gospel, "Grant Us Peace" is a simple prayer that the world may heed God's call for peace among the nations.

This song has a straightforward pop-style arrangement. It would be most effective to sing the refrain at least twice at the end, once *a cappella* (with choral parts) and one final time with the ensemble.

I have used this at the preparation of the gifts and as a Communion song. It would also work well as a gathering or sending forth song for eucharistic liturgies or prayer services. It has become a popular song at peace rallies.


