Composer Notes

The theme of the Spirit has been growing toward the fullness of Pentecost throughout Easter season, beginning with the Second Sunday's Gospel (John 20:19–31). Easter Sunday evening Jesus appears to the disciples in the locked room. Breathing upon them he says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." As God created the first human in God's image by breathing the spirit into clay (Genesis 1:27; 2:7), Christ now recreates the disciples (and the Church) in his own image with the breath of the Spirit. This same passage (without the second half about doubting Thomas) returns at the end of the season on Pentecost. From the Fourth Sunday onward the first reading from Acts of the Apostles shows the Spirit guiding the growth of the new Church. The Gospels of the Sixth Sunday (Years A, C) Jesus speaks of the *Advocate* and the *Spirit of truth* "whom the Father will send in my name" (John 14:26).

On Pentecost, the first reading (Years A, B, C—Acts of the Apostles 2:1–11) recounts the outpouring of the Spirit. Verse four says, "And they were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues." At the end of the reading the astonished crowd says, "we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God" (verse 11). The Roman Missal's Communion antiphon knits these two verses together into a paraphrase: "They were filled with the Holy Spirit, and they spoke of the great things God had done." The refrain of my "Filled with the Spirit" is based on this antiphon. The verses come from the "locked room" Gospel (John 20:19–23), the second reading (1 Corinthians 12:12–13, 27–31), which describes the Spirit animating the body of Christ, and other related Scriptures.

Father John Shea invites us to reflect on the sending of the Spirit in light of the real loss the disciples must have experienced when Jesus parted from them (the Ascension). "Why do you stand looking into heaven?" the two men in white ask the disciples. It's time to get on with the mission! But the disciples may be thinking: "how is this going to be done if Jesus is not here to do it?...What they were watching move ever farther away from them was the One who made it possible for them to love one another. What will happen now that he is gone?" (*An Experience Named Spirit*, Chicago: Thomas More Press, 1983; 29). The outpouring of the Spirit brings a new mode of relationship to the risen One who no longer walks the earth but sits at the right hand of God. This new mode of relating (John 15:4: "remain in me as I remain in you") is made possible through his Spirit poured into our hearts. It makes us the body of Christ. It makes it possible for us, however imperfectly, to be an efficacious sign (sacrament) of the love of God and neighbor effected by Christ in his living, dying, and rising.




