## Composer Notes

Este arreglo musical del Salmo 99 (100) fue compuesto como salmo responsorial para la celebración del Aniversario 150 de la Arquidiócesis de Santa Fe, Nuevo México. Dicha celebración se efectuó el 5 de octubre de 2003.

El Salmo 99 (100) aparece varias veces en el año litúrgico y se puede usar como texto común durante el tiempo ordinario. La Iglesia canta este salmo en el XI Domingo Ordinario, Año A; en el IV Domingo de Pascua, Año C; y en las Lamentaciones, el primer y tercer viernes de cada mes. Este salmo se puede usar como canto de entrada, salida o de los momentos de la misa o salida. También se puede usar para la profesión religiosa, ordenaciones y celebraciones por la unidad de los cristianos.

El arreglo musical es para piano y guitarra. Sin embargo, también se puede acompañar por un cuarteto de cuerdas y arpa. El arreglo coral sirve para un cuarteto de cuerdas, y el de teclado para el arpa.

Nuestra iglesia es el signo visible de Cristo y las ovejas de su rebaño. Este salmo nos recuerda que entrar en la casa del Señor es un privilegio y que rendir culto a Dios con una fe jubilosa en nuestras iglesias es el servicio más importante de nuestro ministerio. Apreciamos la cercanía de Dios mientras cantamos el “Salmo 99: Somos Su Pueblo/Psalm 100: We Are His People”.

*This musical setting of Psalm 100 (99) is the responsorial psalm for the celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, New Mexico. The celebration took place on October 5, 2003.*

*Psalm 100 (99) appears many times throughout the liturgical year and may be used as a common text during Ordinary Time. The Church sings this psalm on the Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time (A), on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, and on the first and third Friday of the month. This psalm has general use as a gathering hymn, a prelude before Mass, or as a recessional. It can also be used for religious profession, ordination, and for celebrations focused on unity of Christians.*

*The musical arrangement is for piano and guitar. However, it may also be accompanied by a string quartet and harp. The strings can play the refrain using the choral arrangement, and the harp can utilize the keyboard score.*

*Our church building is a visible sign of Christ and the sheep of his fold. This psalm reminds us that entering God's house is a privilege and that worshipping God with a joyous faith in our churches is the highest service of ministry. We appreciate the nearness of God as we sing “Salmo 99: Somos Su Pueblo/Psalm 100: We Are His People.”*


