

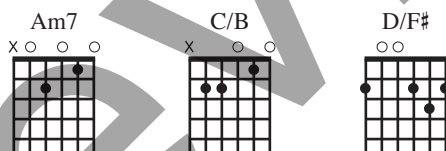
This hymn, evoking scriptural themes stretching from Ash Wednesday through the Lenten season, serves as an introduction and overview of the whole of Lent: led by the spirit, we accompany Jesus on the paschal journey, seeking God’s will and conversion of heart, going down into the waters of death in order to rise up in the waters of everlasting life.

“Led by the Spirit” forms part of a completely through-sung gathering rite for Lent, stretching from the gathering song, through a Kyrie-Litany, to the opening prayer. The full rite may be found in the *Ubi Caritas* choral songbook (OCP Publications, edition 10236).

In addition to its use for gathering, it is also appropriate for dismissal, either as an instrumental or with just a couple of the verses reprised, perhaps verses 1 and 4.
