## Performance Notes

You may choose to use this song with Cantor/Assembly, or as a Solo/SATB reflective piece. It shouldn't be labored, but light and free, taking what is necessary. Either way, let it find its own pace and inner rhythm. It works with guitar, too.

Please note: The vocal harmony is slightly different from the keyboard accompaniment (songbook, GOD, BEYOND ALL NAMES, Ed. 9409), and is not intended to be used simultaneously. Keyboard may double the choir parts, if needed.

Our image of God is inevitably influenced by our society and its language. Studies of hymn-books reveal a preponderance of metaphors based on strength and power, together with almost exclusively male pronouns (none of which is surprising in a patriarchal society). And yet Christian theology recognizes a God who is beyond gender. The scriptures include feminine as well as masculine images of God. Perhaps our own understanding of what it is to be human can be affirmed and valued if our sense of God is not constricted. Through Jesus Christ, we know God to be at the heart of our human condition, in powerlessness, vulnerability and change.

This song has been used in a variety of ways. It was a time of reflection in a hospice for people suffering from AIDS. I would like to think that the words might affirm people in the process of dying in which we are all engaged at different points of the journey.


