*Eucharistic Prayer for Masses with Children II (Acclamations)

Mass of Simplicity may be used in two ways:

1. With assemblies in which the majority are children, the *Eucharistic Prayer for Masses with Children II* may be used.
2. With multi-generational assemblies (e.g., Sunday Mass), using the standard Eucharistic Acclamations (*Holy, We Proclaim Your Death, When We Eat This Bread, Save Us, Savior, Amen*).

*NOTE: The use of the *Eucharistic Prayer for Masses with Children* is restricted to Masses that are celebrated for children only or at Masses at which the majority of the participants are children who have not yet reached the age of preadolescence.




